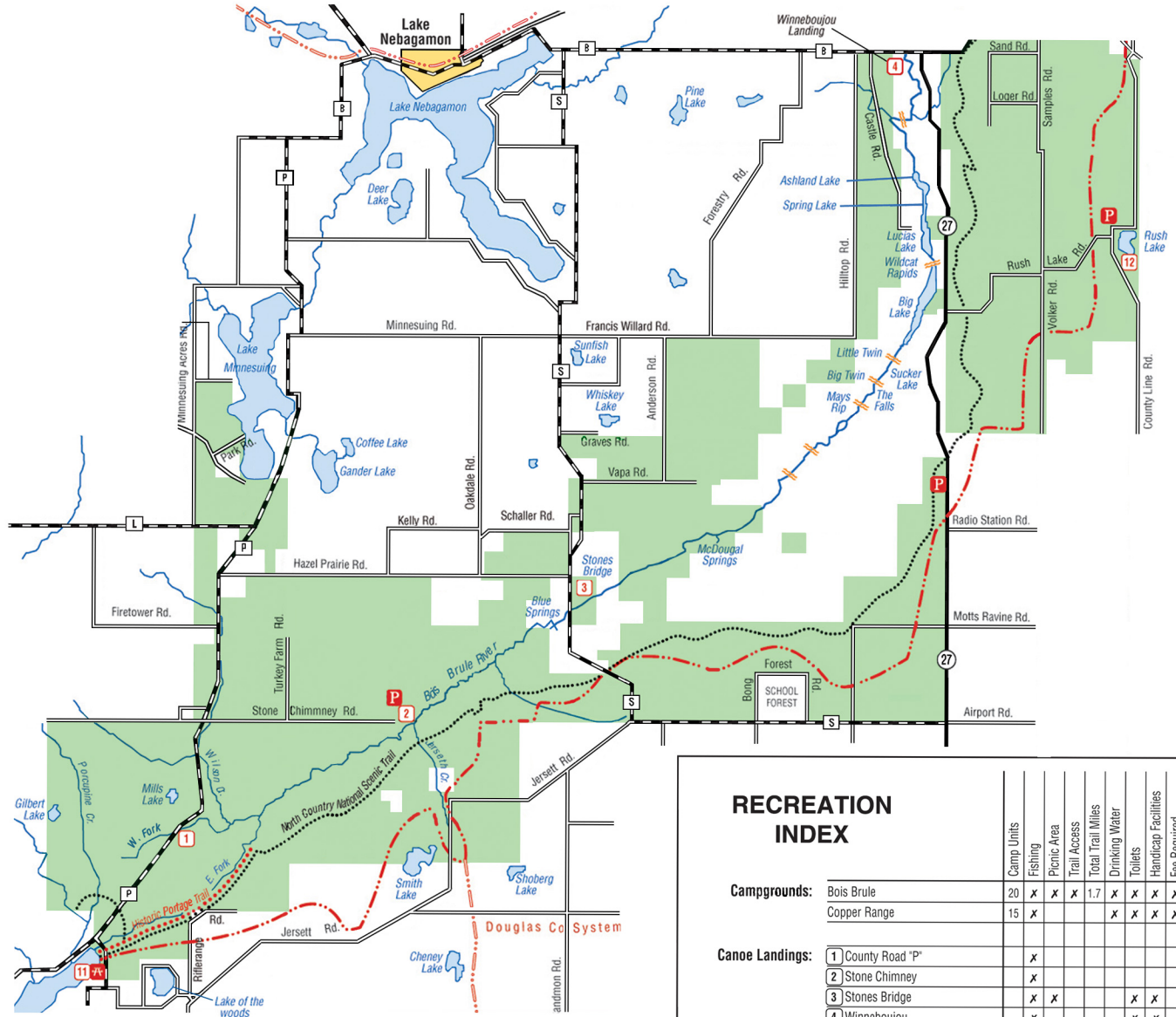
WISCONSIN FORESTRY BRULE RIVER STATE FOREST
